

IWRXOC Club Motorsport Championship 2010

THE SPIRIT OF THE SERIES

Club motorsport should be safe, fun and run in fair spirit. These guidelines are used to ensure a fair and equitable competition. The "spirit" of the guidelines must be adhered to no matter how serious the Championship seems.

Modifications may fall outside those mentioned here so it becomes the onus of the entrant to inform the organisers of the events that he/she enters.

The main aim of the championship is to have fun driving the cars for the purpose for which they were designed.

THE EVENTS

This championship will be run concurrently with the EVO vs WRX Motorsport Series (See separate guidelines).

The Events detailed below are those that will be used for points accrual for the Championship.

- Jacks Hill Climb: 20 March
- AEM Speed Dome Superkhana 11 April
- MC Motorsport Autotest: 4 July
- EVO Vs WRX Grudge Match at Collie: 9 October

Some of the above events will be organised by EvolutionOz but details and entry forms will be on the IWRXOC website and will be broadcast to all Club members.

It is the responsibility of participants to submit relevant entry forms with each event organiser in sufficient time to confirm their entry to that event.

AWARDS

Trophies will be awarded for the following categories:

- IWRXOC Club Motorsport Champion
- Encouragement Award

The Encouragement Award is given to the club member who is deemed by the IWRXOC Committee to have performed at a high standard and generally not to have been previously involved in significant levels of motorsport.

A Ladies Champion Trophy may be awarded if there are sufficient entrants in the category.

POINTS AND ELIGIBILITY

Only IWRXOC members driving Subaru vehicles are eligible for points in the IWRXOC Championship. Points from all rounds will count.

The points structure below is in order of finishing of eligible IWRXOC members only. For example, even though a Club member finishes overall 3rd in the EVO vs WRX competition, if he/she is first IWRXOC member in that event, he/she will score 1st position points in the IWRXOC Championship for that event.

In the event of a tied result for the Championship, the winner shall be the driver with more higher placings.

VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS:

In general, the following requirements will apply for events entered, however, the onus is on the entrant to ensure that his/her car complies with the Supplementary Regulations of each event entered.

- **Fire Extinguisher:** (AS1841, AS1846 or AS1848 - except that neither AS1841.2 nor Halon -1201 or 1311 are permitted) to be securely fixed in an accessible position in the cockpit, with the driver seated and belted.
- **Seat belts:** Must be in good condition and mounted securely. If non-factory belts are fitted, the current CAMS manual provides details of allowable types and method of fitting in Schedule I of General Requirements of Automobiles.
- **Steering:** Must have minimal free-play.
- **Suspension:** Must be in good condition with no significant wear in ball-joints, shock absorber upper mounts, strut assemblies, wheel bearings etc.
- **Brakes:** A firm pedal with no pump-up.

- **Wheels:** Nuts must be tight (factory settings are torque of about 65 ft/LB or metric equivalent), wheel stud threads should be intact and not deformed. Wheels should be free of cracks, dents and excessive scrapes.
- **Tyres:** There are no reliable definitions to use for the below categories other than the manufacturers own marketing and reference material. As a guide, the Series Coordinator will endeavour to periodically seek feedback from manufacturers and importers on their tyre range and make a declaration as to whether any tyre is intended for use in motorsport or not. The tread wear indicators as provided by the manufacturer will be the definitive method of determining minimum tread depth. At no time prior to or during any official practice or racing may the tread wear indicator be exposed. Similarly, where the tread wear indicator is a dimple in the tyres, the wear must not be below these indicators. This does not apply to the shoulder of the tyre where excessive wear may occur due to cornering.

R-Spec Tyres:

These tyres are marketed specifically for motorsport use but are road legal due to the presence of tread-wear indicator bars (or dimples).

A list of tyres eligible for tarmac rally events are listed on the CAMS website and generally Supplementary Regulations of eligible events listed above use the CAMS list as a guide.

Slick Tyres:

These tyres have no visible tread and the wear indicators. These tyres will be marked "Not for Highway Use" or "For Competition Use Only" and are **not** to be used in this series.

Re-tread tyres:

Not permitted.

- **Valve caps:** Must be fitted to all wheels - metal type preferred but plastic will suffice.
- **Body/chassis:** Must be free from damage.
- **Boot/cockpit:** Must be free of all loose articles - e.g. tools, jacks, etc.
- **Under bonnet:** Battery must be secured; fuel lines in good condition and secured, electrical wiring secured and safe, throttle return springs operating correctly. All fluids (oil, water, brake and clutch) must be contained (no leaks) and in plentiful supply.
- **Rollover bar or roll-cage (if fitted):** Must be constructed and fitted in accordance with CAMS specs - refer Schedule J of General Requirements of Automobiles in the current CAMS manual.

PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS:

- **Safety helmet:** To AS1698 (or equivalent) standard and in good condition (i.e. free of dents and scratches). The current CAMS manual lists acceptable alternatives - refer to Schedule D of General Requirements of Automobiles.

- **Footwear:** Must completely cover the foot and be firmly fitted. No sandals or thongs allowed.
- **Driver apparel:** Must cover the body from ankle to neck including up to the wrists. Long sleeved and flame-resistant clothing is mandatory. Wool is best but cotton overalls or trousers and shirts are also suitable. Gloves are optional only.

There may be other additional requirements from the event organiser of a particular event may require. The Supplementary Regulations for each event must be consulted and adhered to.
